Continuing Education Column

Each quarter Alice Johnson-Davis, Guardian's Director of Education, focuses on an educational topic. This edition talks about how to use restraints:

RESTRAINTS

There are times when patients must be restrained for their own safety. When this type of clinical situation occurs, special care must be taken to ensure that the restraint, while protecting the patient, does not HARM the patient.

The Joint Commission has set very specific guidelines in regards to the care of patients in restraints. These guidelines address both the timeframes for physician orders, evaluation of the patient from a physical assessment standpoint, and reevaluation of the need for the restraints.

When an adult is placed in restraints:
An order from a licensed practitioner

must be obtained within 1 hour of placing the patient in restraints.

The need for the restraint must be reevaluated every 4 hours while the patient is in the restraint.

The restraint order must be renewed every 24 hours.

Physical Evaluation of the Patient:

Immediately after placing a patient in restraints, a physical assessment of the patient is to be completed.

Assessment of the patient in restraints is made no less than every 2 hours. The assessment is to evaluate the patient's physical condition as well as

- Signs of injury with the application of the restraint
- Nutrition/hydration
- Circulation and range of motion in the extremity
- Vital signs
- Hygiene and elimination
- Psychological status and comfort
- Readiness for discontinuation of the restraint

Types of restraints: The most common type of restraint may be the side rails of the patient's bed. Bed rails which limit the mobility of the patient may be considered a restraint. On beds which have 4 side rails, one rail should be left down to provide the patient with a means of being mobile from the bed.

Restraints for arms and legs may also be used. These restraints must be tied to non moveable parts of the bed or chair using a quick release knot. The restraint should be tight enough to prevent the patient from causing harm to him/herself, but not tight enough to result in damage to the skin.

Posey vests may also be used to provide patient safety. A posey vest should be applied with the “V” in the front and the ties in the back. Again, the vest should be secured to a non-movable part of the bed or chair.

This is as true for therapists, assistants, RNs and police officers, as it is for lawyers, physicians, and engineers. Any work can be done professionally.

Professionals show self-respect in their work. They’re conscious that their work reflects their inner character. Their work is, among other things, a statement of their personal commitment to excellence of performance. They don’t see work as just a job to be done or merely a source of “spending money.”

They see work as service to others. They labor toward betterment of other people, directly or indirectly: clients, customers, employers, colleagues. Thus they’re both *task-oriented* and *people-oriented*.
